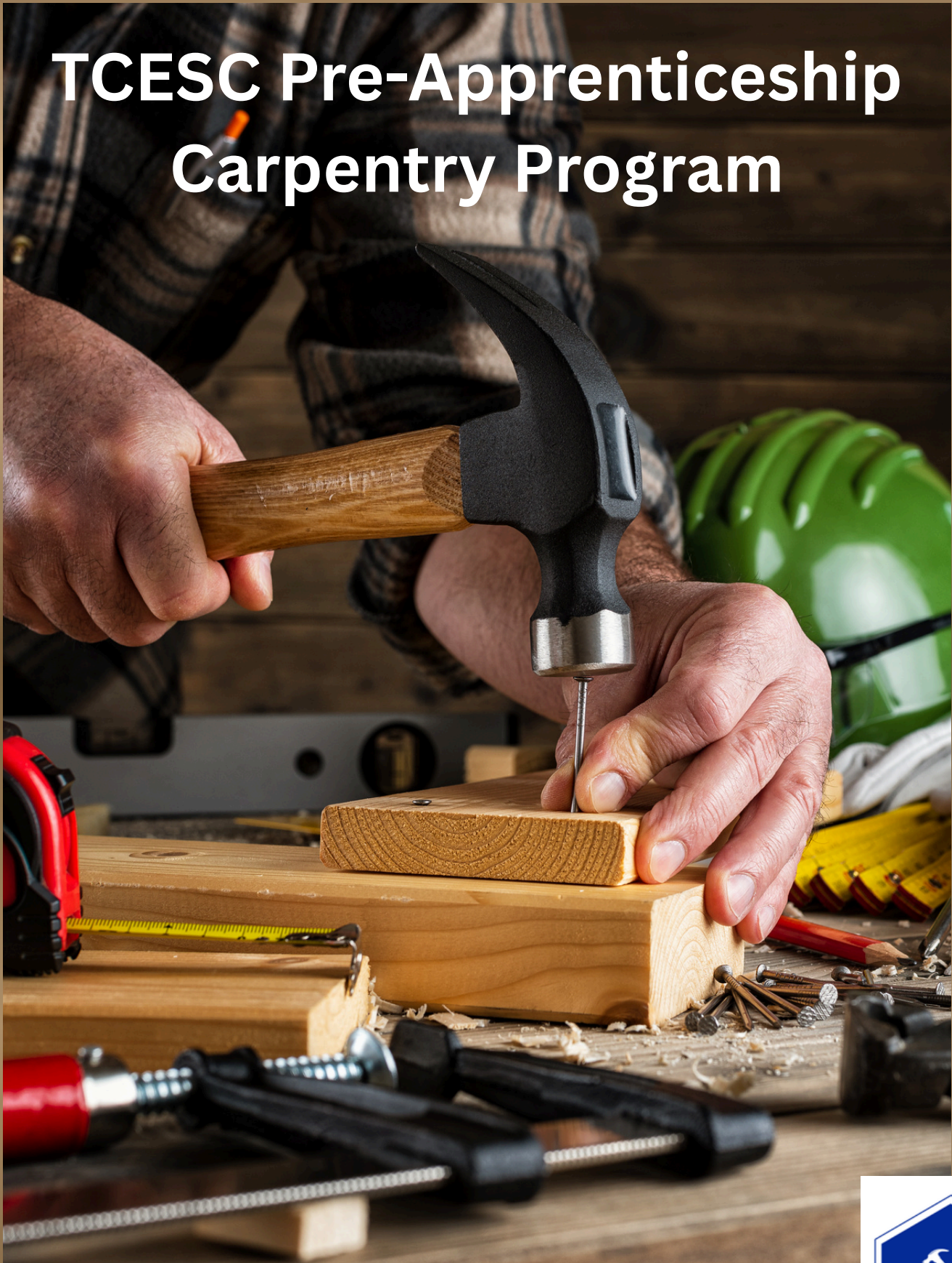


TCESC Pre-Apprenticeship Carpentry Program



Education Extension

The Trumbull County Educational Service Center (TCESC) will offer an Ohio State Apprenticeship Council (OSAC) recognized pre-apprenticeship program to its eligible Trumbull County students.

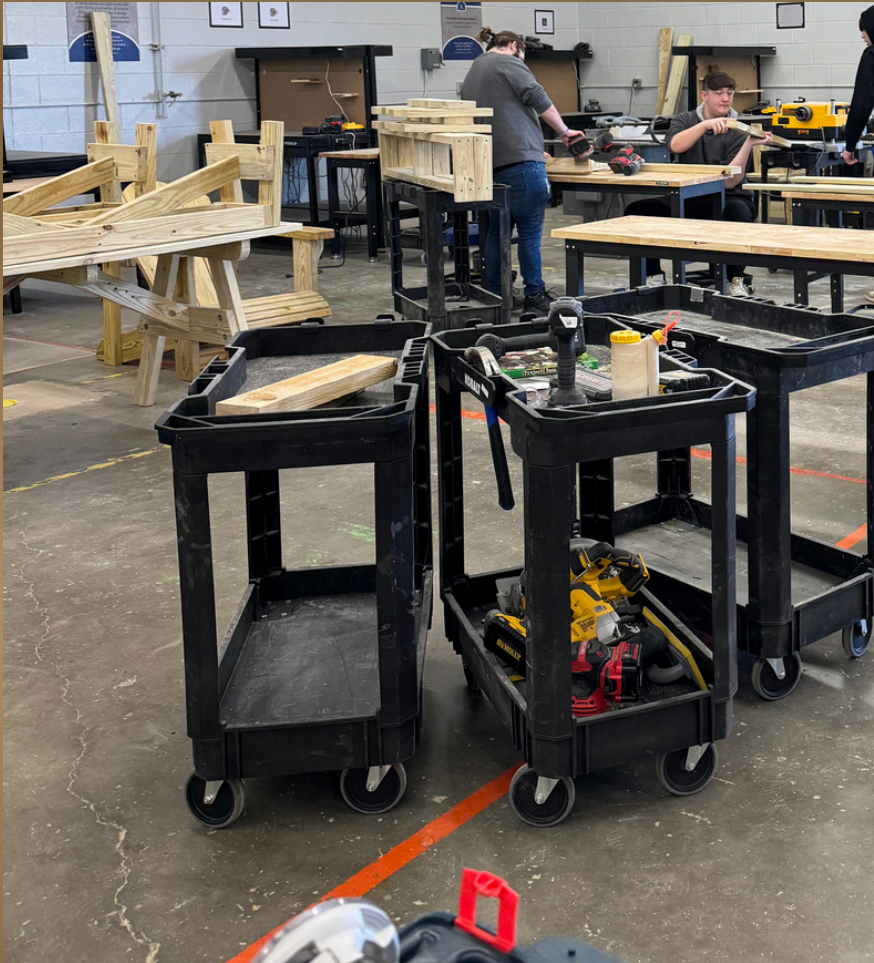
The Education Extension pre-apprenticeship program, falls under the Apprenticeship and Journeyman career fields on both the industry-recognized credential and the Innovative Workforce Incentive Program lists set by the Ohio Department of Education.

Through the Education Extension pre-apprenticeship program, students will gain essential building trades experience using the Career Connections curriculum, which includes instruction in the areas of career-based math, employability skills, and project-based learning, with a focus on the carpentry trade.

The Career Connections curriculum has been approved and adopted by the Ohio Carpenters Joint Apprenticeship Training Center (JATC) apprenticeship program. In addition, the TCESC has established several meaningful partnerships with industry professionals and organizations that have committed to providing educational support and outreach initiatives for students participating in the Education Extension program.

Trained and certified outreach specialists will support the instructor and students through mentorship while also ensuring that safe industry practices are being implemented. Tours of relevant training centers and professional speakers such as contractors and employers will also support the program.

With an approved articulation agreement through the OSAC and upon successful completion of the two-year Education Extension pre-apprenticeship program, each student will be eligible to receive a 12-point industry-recognized credential that potentially gains them direct admission into the Ohio Carpenters apprenticeship program, providing they meet all entry requirements, along with apprenticeship placement services with the support of the Ohio Carpenters JATC.



Participating students will follow their school district's master calendar throughout the school year. Program closure due to inclement weather will also be determined based on the status of the student's home school district. When a participating student's school district is operating on an adjusted bell schedule, such as Early Dismissal, Late Arrival, or a modified special event schedule, the student will be excused from attending the Education Extension program.

Calendar: The first day of class each year falls on the first Tuesday after Labor Day and will end on the Friday before Memorial Day. Dates are subject to change based on the home school district calendars.

- Scheduling will be at the discretion of the Program Supervisor and the home school district. Modifications will be made to accommodate the student and the district.
 - Group 1: 9:30 – 10:30 am
 - Group 2: 12:30 – 1:30 pm

Grading Policy

Students will receive a grade, according to the grading scale outlined below, reflecting their performance in the program. Work will be assigned and graded both in the classroom and workshop setting. One grade will be awarded to each student according to the grading period timeline determined by that student's home school district. The student's home school district will award the course grade and credit as reported by the program.

- A: 90 -100%
- B: 80 – 89%
- C: 70 – 79%
- D: 60 – 69%
- F: 0 – 59%

Program Meeting Norms

- All students will constructively participate.
- All students will respect the viewpoints of others.
- All students will stay on task and maintain attention and focus.
- All students will manage their time wisely, including course attendance and task completion.
- All students will report to course sessions prepared and ready to learn.

Program Objectives

Commitment

- The Education Extension program requires a two-year daily commitment to attending, engaging, and working towards earning industry-recognized credentials.

Alignment

- With the successful completion of the Education Extension Pre-Apprenticeship Program, students will satisfy one of the alternate pathways to graduation while acquiring the necessary state of Ohio diploma seals.

Development

- Throughout the Education Extension program, students will develop their understanding of employability skills and career-based mathematics while receiving project-based learning in a simulated work environment that focuses on the carpentry trade.

Certification

- During the Education Extension program, students will earn industry-recognized credentials culminating in a certificate of completion from an Ohio registered pre-apprenticeship program.

Transition

- The Education Extension will work individually with its graduates to create an action plan that ensures a successful transition following high school.

Registration

- Students will be enrolled in the Education Extension program based upon the recommendation of the administration and/or school counselors of the aligned school districts.
- Initial registration is held in the Spring prior to the upcoming school year.
